

# Discover Mulhouse and its environs...

## The Museums

### To discover by tram or tram-train

**1 Musée de l'Impression sur Étoffes**  
**Museum of Printed Textiles**  
(Tram stop: Gare Centrale)  
Discover the history of printed cotton in Alsace and throughout the world, and an exceptional collection of textiles and machines.

**2 Cité de l'Automobile National Museum**  
**Collection Schlumpf** (Tram stop: Musée de l'Auto)  
Admire 400 amazing cars, settle yourself at the wheel of a Talbot racing car, crank up the engine, take part in a Grand Prix race or drive a high-powered racing car in the Le Mans 24 hours; there are a thousand and one ways of enjoying the world of the automobile.

**3 Musée des Beaux Arts**  
**Fine Arts Museum «Villa Steinbach»**  
(Tram stop: République)  
The museum now hosts a collection beginning in the 15th century with an altarpiece from Rheinfelden, followed by the classical period with Brueghel, Boucher and more.

**4 La Cité du Train - Railway museum**  
(Bus stop: Musées)  
The Mulhouse Cité du Train has the largest collection of railway equipment in continental Europe. With its collection of a hundred or so steam engines, electric engines, railcars, prestigious carriages and wagons, it traces a century and a half of the history of the railway in France.

**5 The Musée EDF Electropolis**  
**Electricity museum** (Bus stop: Musées)  
Designed as a culture and communication centre, Electropolis, the biggest museum in Europe devoted to electricity, paves the way for a new generation of museums. Visitors are invited to experiment with electricity in all its forms.

**6 Historical museum** (Tram stop: République)  
In the centre of Mulhouse old town and inside the former town hall, discover the history of the city, from Palaeolithic times to modern day, as well how Alsatians used to live.

**7 The Musée des Amis de Thann Museum of the Friends of Thann**  
(Stop: Thann Centre)  
Discover the fascinating history of the potash mine in Alsace together with a former minor.

**8 The Joseph Else Mine Museum**  
(Tram stop: Thann Centre)  
Discover the fascinating history of the potash mine in Alsace together with a former minor.

### To discover by bus

**9 Musée du Papier Peint**  
**Wallpaper Museum, Rixheim**  
(Bus stop: Commanderie)  
This gives a full panorama, from the 18th century dominoes to the latest creations, with wallpaper from all over the world.  
-Weekdays: bus line **18** towards «Chemin Vert»; get off at the «Commanderie» bus stop  
-Sundays and holidays: line **67** towards «Chemin Vert»; get off at the «Commanderie» bus stop

**10 The Kunsthalle: Contemporary art centre**  
(Tram stop: Tour Nessel or bus **10** stop Fonderie)  
In a 700 m² area, The Kunsthalle hosts and produces temporary exhibitions dedicated to contemporary creation.

## Art and history

### To discover by tram or tram-train

**11 The Station** (Tram stop: Gare Centrale)  
Built in 1928, it is a station on the TGV East line.



**12 Chapelle Saint-Jean (13th century chapel)** (Tram stop: Porte Haute)  
A listed monument. Exhibitions and concerts from May to September.

**13 Maison Loewenfels (13th century)**  
(Tram stop: Mairie)

**14 La cour des Chaînes**  
(Tram stop: Mairie)

**15 Sainte-Marie Church (13th century)**  
(Tram stop: Mairie)

**16 Municipal baths** (Tram stop: Mairie)  
Swimming pool and Roman baths.

**17 Sculpture gardens**  
(Tram stop: Nordfeld)  
In the Allée William Wyler, a park where you can wander among sculptures by Anne-Marie Schoen, Yves Carrey, Matt-Halm, Christian Ingold and Vincente Blanchard.

**18 Square de la Bourse and the Industrial Society** (Tram stop: République)  
An architectural ensemble created in 1826 by the industrialists in Mulhouse.

**19 Departure point for the 19th century tourist trail** (Tram stop: République)

**20 Historical Museum – Town Hall – Temple Saint Etienne, 14th century stained glass windows**  
(Tram stop: République)

**21 Birthplace of Captain Dreyfus**  
(Tram stop: République)

**22 Bollwerk Tower** (Tram stop: Porte Jeune)  
Remains of the old medieval town (listed monument).

**23 Europe Tower** (Tram stop: Porte Jeune)  
A skyscraper in the city centre, whose triangular shape symbolises the Mulhouse region, an intersection between three European countries: Germany, France and Switzerland. Revolving panoramic restaurant at the top of the 30-floor building.

**24 Nessel Tower and the Devil's Tower**  
(Tram stop: Tour Nessel)  
Remains of the city fortifications from the Middle Ages.

**25 Saint-Thiébaud collegiate church**  
(Tram stop: Thann Centre)  
It took 2 centuries to build, from the end of the 13th century to 1516.

**26 Engelbourg Castle (13th century)**  
(Tram stop: Thann Centre)

**27 Tour des Sorcières (Witches' Tower) and the Southern Gateway to the Alsace Wine Route**  
(Tram stop: Thann Centre)

**28 Saint-Dominique church**  
(Tram stop: Vieux-Thann)  
Church founded in 991 by the Bishop of Strasbourg.



## Art along the tramway

Enjoy the many works of art along the tramway and at the stops on line **1**.

Admire the coloured steel arches made by Daniel Buren at each stop on line **2**.

### To do by tram or tram-train

**34 Water sports centre**  
(Tram stop: Université)  
An open-air leisure centre (pools, diving boards, play areas and sports facilities).

**35 Sports Stadium**  
(Tram stop: Palais des Sports)  
Top level sports events.

**36 Olympic skating rink**  
(Tram stop: Palais des Sports)

**37 Bouleaux Golf Course**  
(Tram stop: Graffenwald)

### To do by tram or tram-train

**38 Kinopolis Multiplex**  
(Tram stop: Nouveau Bassin)  
Cinema multiplex with 14 screens

**39 Le Palace cinema** (Tram stop: Porte Jeune)  
Cinema complex with 8 screens.

**40 Bel Air cinema** (Tram stop: Bel Air)  
An 'art et essai' (independent) listed cinema.

**41 La Filature** (Tram stop: Nordfeld)  
National theatre for drama, dance, music, opera and exhibitions with media library.

**42 L'Entrepôt (The Warehouse)**  
(Tram stop: Nordfeld) Comedy theatre.

**43 Theatre de la Sinne**  
(Tram stop: République)

**44 Le Noumatrouff** (Tram stop: Musée de l'Auto)  
Music Hall (rock music, jazz).

**45 Le Parc Expo** (Tram stop: Musée de l'Auto)  
Events, trade fairs, exhibitions, concerts, etc.

**46 Thann regional cultural centre**  
(Tram stop: Thann Centre)  
Cinema, exhibitions, concerts, theatre, etc.

**47 Espace Grün** (Tram stop: Cernay)  
Cinema, exhibitions, concerts, theatre, etc.

**48 Parc à Cigognes (Stork Park)**  
(Tram stop: Cernay)

**49 Parc des Rives de la Thur**  
(Park on the banks of the Thur) (Tram stop: Cernay)  
Splendid 12-hectare park on the banks of the river.

### Go by bus!

**50 Zoo and Botanical Gardens**  
(Bus stop: Zoo)  
Come and see 1,200 animals representing 190 species from all the continents, and nearly 900 species of trees, with flowers of exceptional colour and scent. A magnificent botanical collection with something to enjoy in each season.  
-Weekdays, Sundays and holidays: bus line **30** towards «Hôpital E.Muller»; get off at the zoo bus stop
